Re: Contraceptives Pharmacy Benefit for Preferred Administrators Members

Effective **March 1, 2013** Preferred Administrators in conjunction with OptumRx, our Pharmacy Benefit Manager, mailed a letter to all Preferred Administrators members informing them about the following changes to their benefits.

In order to comply with the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA), or "Health Care Reform," changes have been made to Preferred Administrator's formulary. As of August 1, 2012, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, or "health care reform" requires pharmacy benefit contraception coverage for women. The law requires 100 percent coverage of FDA-approved contraceptive methods. This means that for certain products, women will not be charged co-payment, co-insurance or deductible when using a network pharmacy. Please see attached list of contraceptives covered at 100% with a cost share of \$0.

- If a contraceptive is not listed, members will need to pay the applicable co-payment or coinsurance.
- If a contraceptive is listed, the member's cost share will be \$0.

Preferred Administrators received confirmation on March 17, 2014 that IUDs *are not* part of the enclosed list. Therefore, our system has been set up to continue paying for the device as a medical benefit in addition to the insertion/removal. Please continue using the IUDs you have in stock and bill Preferred Administrators for the device and the insertion/removal. We will go back to October 1, 2013 and re-process any denials for the device with the following edit "not covered by this payer/contractor" for claims billed within a timely filing deadline. Since this is a preventive benefit covered at 100%, no copay will apply regardless of the brand used.
