For adults 65 or older who do not have an	Administer 1 dose of PPSV23
immunocompromising condition,	 Anyone who received any doses of PPSV23 before age 65 should receive one final dose of the
cerebrospinal fluid leak, or cochlear implant and want to receive PPSV23 only	vaccine at age 65 or older. Administer this last dose at least 5 years after the prior PPSV 23 dose
For adults 65 years or older who do not have	Administer one dose of PCV13 first, then give one dose of PPSV23 at least one year later
an immunocompromising condition,	 Anyone who received any doses of PPSV23 before age 65 should receive one final dose of the
cerebrospinal fluid leak, or cochlear implant	vaccine at age 65 or older. Administer this last dose at least 5 years after the prior PPSV23
and want to receive PCV13 and PPSV23
